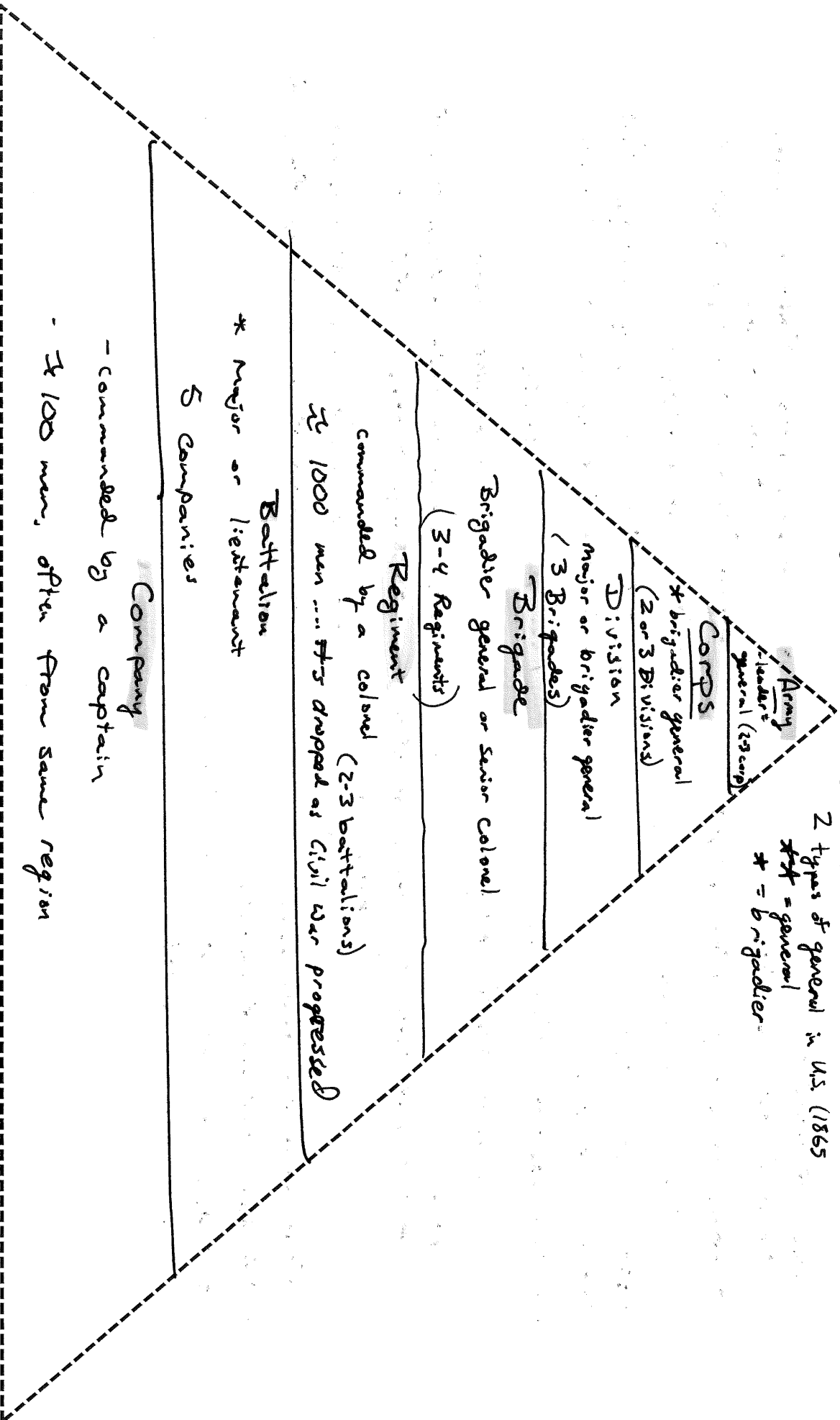


Organization

<p>Infantry a.k.a foot soldier * most of wars casualties Commonly fought w/ 1861 Springfield Fired a Minnie ball - Fired 3x / minute - 16 inch bayonet 31 regiments from Michigan</p>	<p>Artillery - Cannon * Smoothbore bronze Napoleon Cannon * most common 3-inch Ordnance / Parrott gun → rifled Six Cannon = battery uses → attack enemy guns, buildings, infantry Canister shot → tin can w/ lead balls MI sent 14 batteries</p>
<p>Cavalry Eyes + ears of Army <u>Weapons</u> Saber, 6-shot revolver, carbine (shot rifle) ↳ loaded breech 47x / min 1864 → Spencer = common carbine 11 Michigan regiments of cavalry Gettysburg → Custer saved Union rear in leading cavalry battle</p>	<p>Sharpshooters - excellent marksmen - used prior to major battles to shoot oncoming troops & officers Colonel Hiram Berdan's First & Second U.S. Sharpshooters had many from MI</p>
